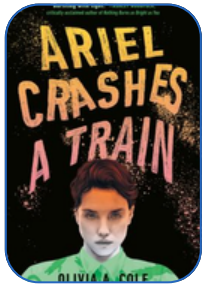

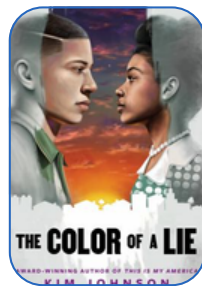


ARIEL CRASHES A TRAIN

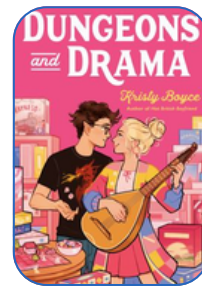
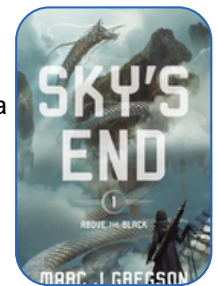


THE COLOR OF A LIE

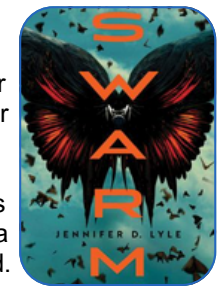


DUNGEONS AND DRAMA

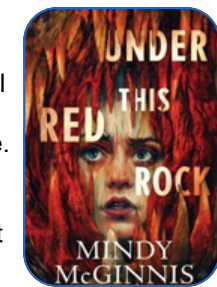


FITTING INDIAN
